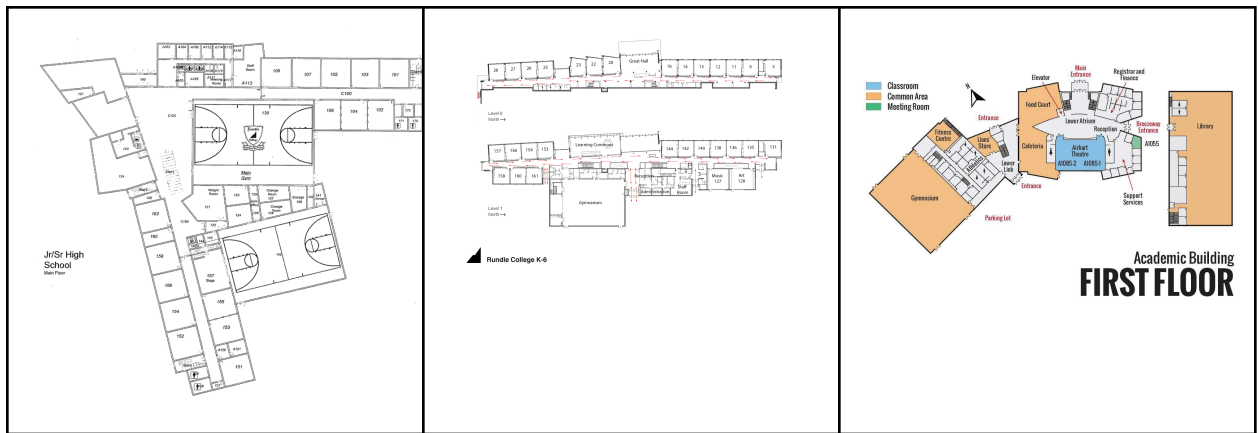

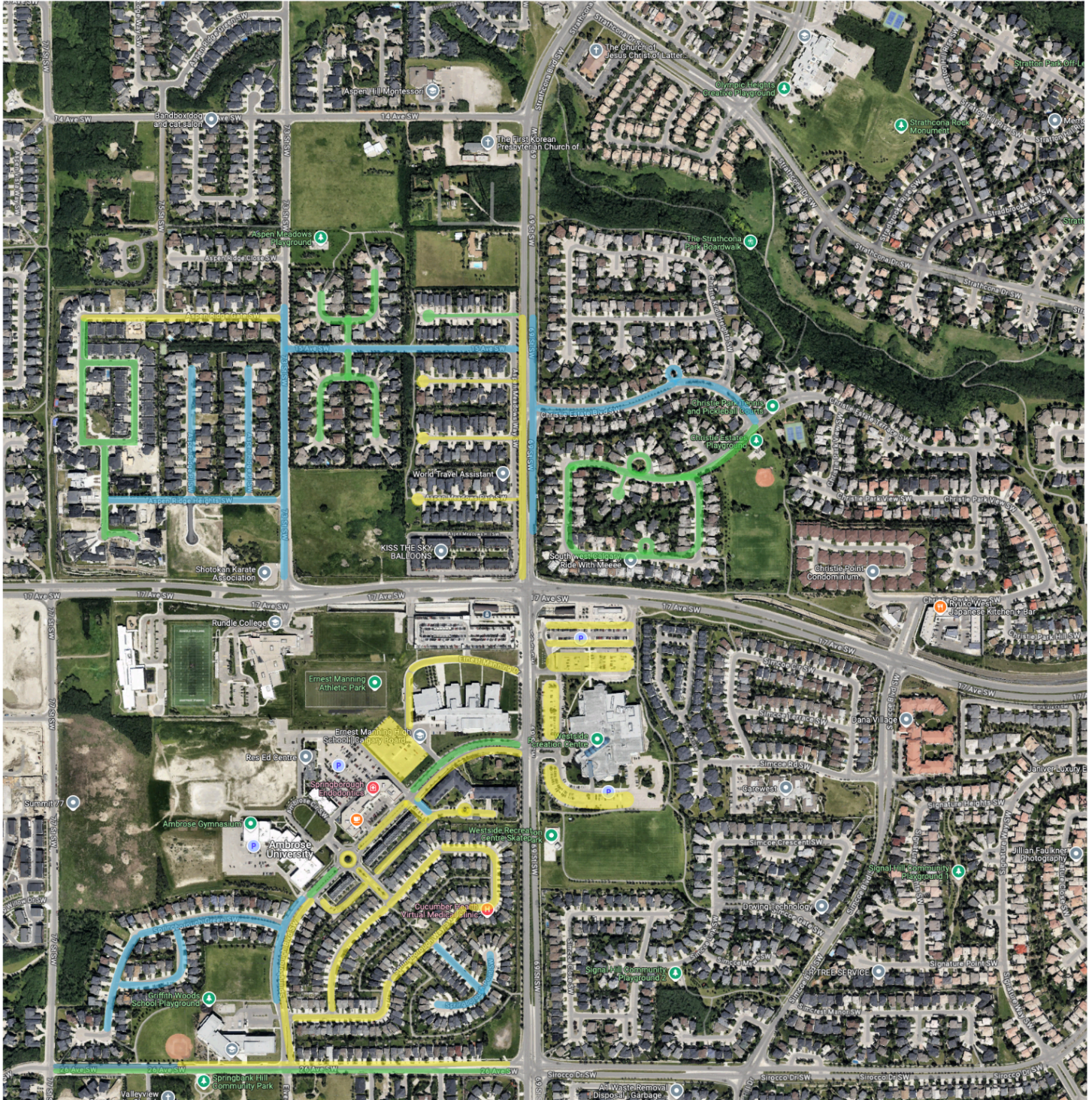

Rundle School Rules:

Our students will be in class on Wednesday during the photo shoot and team practices, and they also have class on Thursday. We ask that people be courteous and respectful throughout the tournament. Please be sure to only use your gym footwear and practice ball(s) provided by the host when in the gymnasium. There should be absolutely no warming up or playing with the basketballs in the hallways and common areas. There should be ample warm-up time prior to games.

The washrooms are located at the end of each hallway as the changerooms will only be available for teams during the tournament.

No Smoking Policy

All schools are smoke-free and vape-free facilities. Smoking and vaping by athletes, coaches, parents, and spectators are prohibited on all campus grounds.

Team Hosts:

Teams will be provided a host (Grade 7 student) for the opening ceremonies. Throughout the tournament please look for a Rundle volunteer in burgundy for assistance.

Team Rooms / Change Rooms:

Change rooms will be available for the teams before their game and to meet as a team during halftime. Teams will be asked to place their belongings behind their benches so that the change room is available for the next team after half-time. Do not leave personal items in the change rooms. Please be advised that Rundle College or Ambrose University is NOT responsible for lost or stolen articles.

The Aux Gym will be changed into a player's lounge on Friday and Saturday. Players and coaches will be encouraged to meet here before and after the games.

Coaches & Officials Room:

A hospitality room will be available for coaches and officials throughout the tournament. A variety of food & beverages will be available. The hospitality room will be in the school staff room. There will be a separate room for referee meetings and evaluations. Coaches are encouraged to talk to refs privately over issues and questions and keep the hospitality room to social discussions and encouragement.

Officials and Minor Officials:

Officials:

The Alberta Basketball Officials Association (ABOA) is recognized to provide officials for provincial competitions. Arrangements for officials at all provincial competitions shall be made by the Executive Director and/or appointees of the ASAA Executive in cooperation with the ABOA.

Minor Officials:

Minor officials (scorekeepers) are students/staff/parents from Rundle College. Please treat them with respect and understanding; they are volunteering to help make the event run as smoothly as possible. Each scorekeeping table will be supervised by Game Directors.

If you or the team has any concerns with the scorekeeping, a member of the coaching staff or teacher supervisor will address it through the Game Director. Do not direct comments to the minor officials. Spectators will not address any officials/minor officials at any time, or they will be asked to leave the facility promptly.

Discipline and Misconduct:

Grievance Committee:

The committee will have the authority to address issues of a serious nature that may occur before, during or after the provincial championships, or to hear appeals of the automatic suspension resulting from an ejection.

Appeals:

If an athlete or coach wishes to appeal an ejection, it is the responsibility of the Grievance/Discipline Committee to address the appeal as soon as possible, and before the next scheduled game, match etc. To handle appeals of an ejection, ASAA Policy states: "All ASAA Provincial Championship Hosts will convene a Discipline/Appeal Committee. The Committee will have the authority to address issues of a serious nature that may occur before, during or after a Provincial Championship match, or to hear appeals of the automatic suspension resulting from an ejection. The Committee may include, but not be limited to, the Tournament Chairperson, an official and two coaches not in conflict with the issue.

Ejections:

Any unsportsmanlike or violent behavior (eg. fighting) that results in an ejection of an athlete or coach from play in an ASAA provincial competition shall result in a suspension from the next scheduled game (round, bout, etc. as appropriate for the sport) of the current season.

ASAA Spectator Code of Conduct

Spectators, both student and adult, must demonstrate courtesy and good sportsmanship by positive cheers of encouragement for their team, not against the opposing team. This is evidenced by the absence of booing and vulgarities. Spectators must also show proper acceptance of officials' judgment.

Artificial noisemakers are not permitted during provincial championship tournaments/events. These noisemakers may include but are not limited to: air horns, cowbells, plastic tube horns, garbage can lids, etc. The provincial championship host shall have the authority to eject from the competition facility individuals who, following a warning, refuse to comply with this requirement.

The Executive Committee or its host/designated representative shall have the authority to direct any person to immediately leave any premises or venue hosting any ASAA-sanctioned event if that person:

1. Exhibits rude or abusive behaviour to any other person;
2. Uses vulgar, obscene or abusive language and/or gestures;
3. Fails to promptly follow any reasonable direction given to that person by the designated representative of the ASAA

Awards Presentation:

Awards will be presented immediately following the Championship, 3rd Place and Consolation Championship games. In accordance with the ASAA, Team Sportsmanship Awards will be presented by the ASAA to the recipient school at a time shortly after the competition.

Sportsmanship:

Sportsmanship is vitally important and valued by the ASAA. A Sportsmanship plaque, keychains and pins will be awarded to the team that displays appropriate conduct & sportsmanship both individually and at a team level throughout the Championship. Pins will be handed out throughout the Championship to individuals & spectators who display sportsmanship in their words & actions. The sportsmanship committee will be deciding who receives these awards.

Athletic Trainer:

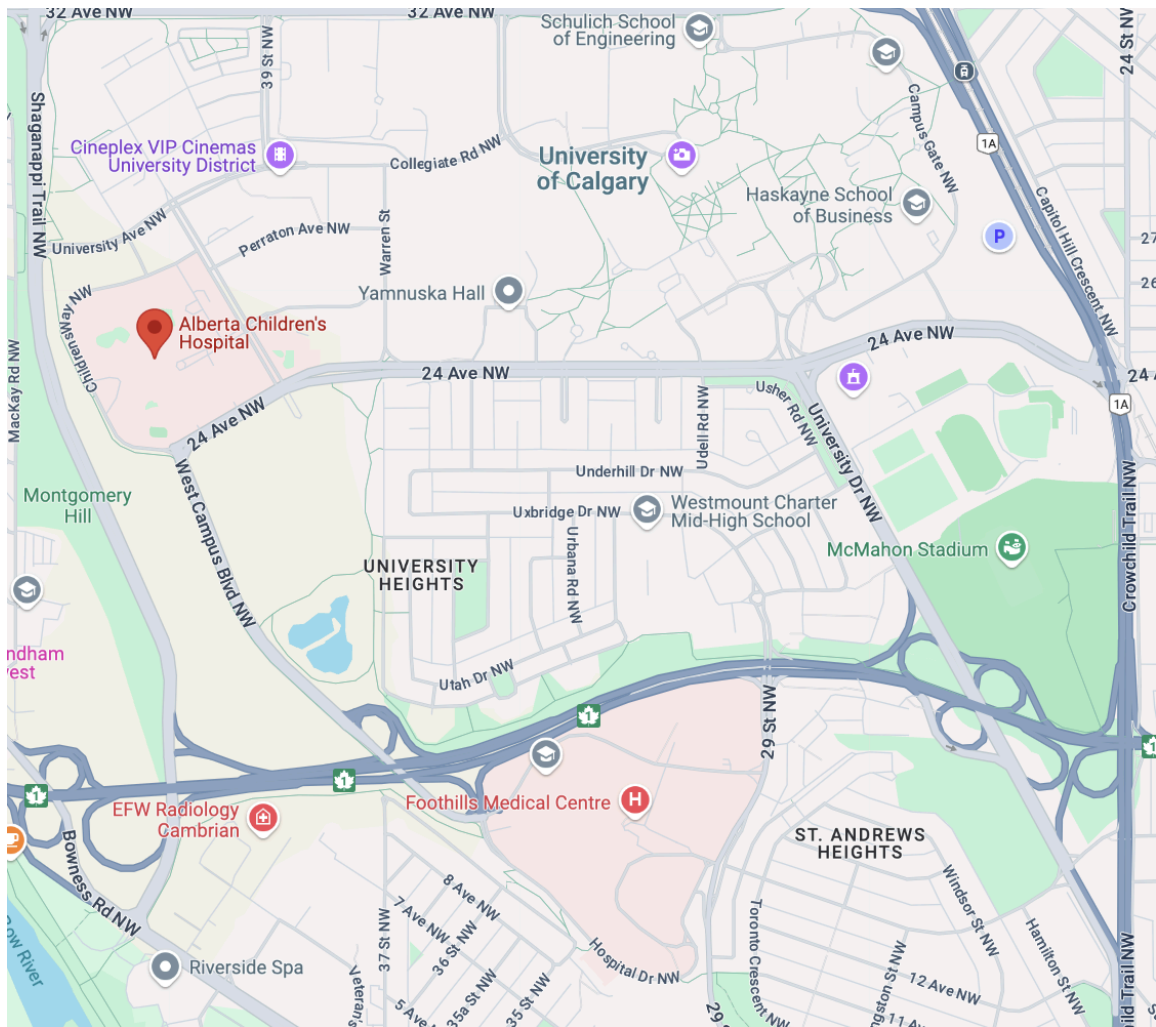
Teams must bring their own medical supplies and plan to do their own taping. Ice will be provided. A certified athletic trainer will be on-site at Rundle College for the duration of the tournament to assist with first-aid. Any pre-existing injuries are to be dealt with by the individual, parent, medical professional or coach prior to games.

Emergency Action Plan:

Our facility has Emergency Exit Signs in all spaces. In the unlikely event of a fire or other emergency please use the nearest exit. Upon exiting the building, all coaches are responsible to ensure their team members are kept in a group and need to report any athletes unaccounted for to a member of the organizing committee. The muster point is Hawk Field (Football Field).

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When an Injury Occurs:

1. Take control of the situation. Exercise universal precautions related to blood/body fluids.
2. Do not move the athlete if they cannot move themselves. Do not remove the uniform unless deemed necessary.
3. Assess and evaluate the severity of the situation and decide if further assistance is required.
4. If an ambulance is required; then determine the action required to remove the athlete from the playing surface.
5. If an ambulance is called: Direct one person to call the ambulance and give the pertinent information to them. Include the location, address, and extent of injury.
6. Ask the person to report back with an ETA.
7. Remain with injured athlete and address any concerns they have while awaiting medical attention.
8. Do not give food or drink to an injured athlete unless required because of existing medical conditions.

9. Stay calm and reassuring.
10. Once an ambulance arrives, explain the situation and what has been done for the injured athlete.
11. Designate an adult to accompany the injured athlete to the hospital.
12. Parents /guardians of the injured athlete must be contacted as soon as possible following the injury

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
