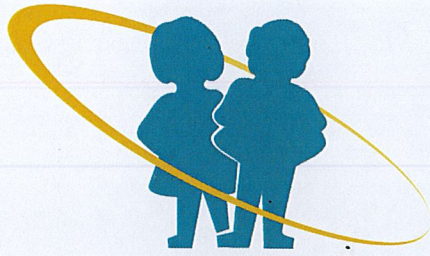
Welcome to Cremona School
